A CITY OF GROWTH



ANIMAL & EQUINE



In partnership with Eccles Sixth Form College, our courses have been designed to offer a strong sector-related emphasis on practical skills development. Animal management students will study at Eccles Sixth Form College. Which houses over 250 different species, including both domestic and exotic animals. This gives our students access to a diverse selection of birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians, invertebrates, and fish to enhance their curriculum. Some of the exciting new additions include common marmosets, white naped cranes, capybara, alpaca, striped skunk, tarantula, Asian water dragons, pygmy goats, and many more.

Our Higher Education animal management courses have even featured on BBC One North West Tonight for their collaboration with the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS). Students were filmed on their placement with the RHS as they worked on the new 63-hectare garden at RHS Bridgewater.

The career opportunities that follow such varied courses, with equally dynamic work placements, might include working in animal science, pet care, for an animal charity, animal training, animal health industries, and animal grooming. The course gives you endless career prospects depending on your interests and what you feel most passionate about.

FEES & FINANCE

HOW TO FINANCE YOUR STUDIES

Students applying for Higher Education courses can get help with tuition fee costs or pay in monthly instalments. These include:

STUDENT FINANCE ENGLAND

Full-time students can apply for a tuition fee loan of up to £9,250 per year and for a maintenance loan of up-to £8,700 per year depending on household income. You will not start re-paying until the April after graduation and when you start earning £25,000 per year.

MAINTENANCE LOAN

University living costs include accommodation, utilities, travel, food, stationery and any course materials. To help you with these costs, you may be entitled to apply for a maintenance loan. This is a means-tested loan and will take a number of factors into consideration including:

- Household income: this is the total gross income of the students' parent(s), caregivers, or spouse living in the household in which the student lives
- Students with a dependent child/ren or spouse may also be entitled to extra funding to support them such as a Childcare Grant, Parents Learning Allowance, or an Adult Dependants' Grant

Other factors may be taken into account. For further information on eligibility, please visit the Student Finance England website. You apply for your maintenance loan at the same time as your tuition fee loan and it is paid directly into your bank account in three instalments. The first instalment will be paid once your attendance at the University Centre has been confirmed.

STEP 1

Think about what you want to study, what career you want and which subject will best help you achieve your goal.

If we make you an offer we'll invite you to one of our taster days held at various points in the year.

STEP 6

Once you have your offer you should think about how you'll pay for the course, most likely through a student loan www.gov.uk/student-finance.

STEP 8

Once your place is confirmed, we'll welcome you to enrolment and induction in September when you'll meet your tutors and other students on your course.

STEP 7

If you have a conditional offer, your results should be available in July or August. If you have met the conditions, we will confirm your offer to you. If you haven't met the conditions, you may still have options available through Clearing. Please contact us to explore these options.
